## **Orchestra news:**

Although we were not able to put on a live or virtual performance this year, we can be proud of other achievements.

First, we found a new rehearsal space. The Seattle Presbytery informed us in late July that our lease would be terminated at the end of August. Both the band and our group started hunting for a new space immediately. Thanks to the efforts of a few of our members, we were able to find a new home at Our Saviour's Lutheran Church in Burien, and we moved both groups' belongings in late August. The new space has some nice features, including a larger storage room, several potential practice spaces (which will allow sectionals), and easy access from state route 509. The pastor at the church is quite interested in our mission, and he looks forward to some sort of collaborative efforts in the future.

Second, we organized 8 small ensembles, and each group prepared pieces to record and distribute electronically to the retirement homes we would normally visit. We applied for and were awarded a \$3500 grant from 4Culture to purchase equipment and other items that allow us to "reopen"—in our case, to prepare and record music for retirement community members to watch online. We purchased recording equipment and appropriate PPE with the funds and were less than a week from starting to

record when new restrictions on gatherings went into effect in mid-November. As a result, we have had to postpone the recording sessions until it is safe to get together again. If Covid cooperates, we'll record in the next few months, and we will organize another round of ensembles in the spring.

Third, we will still be able to claim our 4Culture Sustained Support award despite not having any performances in 2020, and our award should be automatically renewed for 2021 without any competitive process or onsite visits. Nevertheless, our expenses exceed the amount of these awards. We still have to pay rent to the church and pay for insurance and other miscellaneous expenses.
